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# Overview

- Substantial Month-Over Job Growth
  - MSA May-June +11,900 jobs (Apr-May +2,800; Mar-Apr +1,800)
- Substantial layoff announcements in second half
- Signs of slowing employer demand
- Inflation Easing but Prices Still High
  - Peak 9% in June 2022; 3% in July 2023
  - Target 2%
  - Federal Funds rate at 5.4%—22-year high
- San Jose rents high but stable after steep increases in prior year
- 25% South Bay households below Real Cost Measure (United Way)




#### **MSA Unemployment Rate Historical Trend**




#### Santa Clara County Unemployment Rate Historical Trend










# **Employer Demand Job Postings Analysis**




#### **Unduplicated Job Postings: July-June**



#### San Jose Rent Growth Over Past 12 Months








#### Annual Change in Median Rent


San Jose, CA: 2019 - Present


