

Out of School Youth

- Enrollments – As of 3/19/24, we have enrolled 125 youth participants - 100% of our 200-enrollment goal.
- 22/23 Placements – 148 youth placements. 87% in priority sector. Majority placed in Business, Manufacturing, and IT
- Districts – 33% of our youth participants reside in Districts 4, 5 and 6. District 4 covers the NE San Jose, District 5 East San Jose, and District 6 the Fruitdale area. All are low resource areas.

- Partnerships – Due to our high number of homeless and unstably housed youth, we have formed partnerships with organizations that provide housing assistance and support services such as Bill Wilson Center, Covenant House, and Jamboree Housing.

Adult/DW

- Enrollments – As of 3/19/24, we have enrolled 885 Adult participant- 168% of YTD goal and 173 dislocated workers – 120% of goal.

- 22/23 Placements –820 A/DW placements. 80% in priority sector. Majority placed in Health Care, Manufacturing and IT.
- Districts – 30% of A/DW participants reside in Districts 2, 3, and 5. District 2 covers South San Jose, District 3 Downtown and 5 East San Jose. Districts 3 and 5 are low resource areas.

In School Youth

- New Enrollments 92
 - Demographics:
 - 21% Clients have a disability
 - 73% female
 - 27% male
 - 85% under 18
 - 15% over 18
 - 14% completed 10th grade (are in 11th)
 - 77% completed 11th grade (are in 12th)
 - 6% African American/Black
 - 2% African American/black and Asian
 - 3% American Indian Alaska Native
 - 17% Asian
 - 1% Hawaiian/Pacific Island
 - 54% Do not wish to answer—92% answered Hispanic/Latino.
 - 16% white--92% answered Hispanic/Latino.
 - 71% total are Hispanic/Latino
 - Low Income
 - 5% receive TANF
 - 13% receive GA/MediCal
 - 59% receive SNAP
 - Barriers
 - 4% are current or former foster youth
 - 3% are justice involved
 - 1% are pregnant/parenting
 - 15% are Basic Skills Deficient
 - Unstable Housing: 3%
 - 67% ESL—in ELD classes
 - How many from each District and (East San Jose)
 - 41% from East Side (zip codes 95116, 95121, 95122, 95127, 95148)
 - 12% from downtown
- Outcomes: 2022-23 & 2023-24

- Training – Most of our clients in training go to BAMA for the 3-in-1
- Work-Experience
 - 22-23: 37 WEX
 - 23-24: 47 WEX so far
- Placements
 - 24 of last year's WEX participants are employed or in school (or both)
- Outreach/Partnerships
 - SVCTE—about 76 referrals
 - Probation Department—Secure Track and The Ranch—about 5 referrals
 - Opportunity Youth Academy—about 16 referrals
 - New Hope for Youth—about 10 referrals
 - SJ Works—about 6 referrals
 - James Lick High School (less involved)--about 3 referrals
 - Downtown College Prep, El Primero (less involved)--about 27—but only about 3 enrolled
 - Foothills High School (less involved)--about 25—but only about 3 enrolled
