

STAFF REPORTS: PATHWAY TO SELF-SUFFICIENCY

So far, staff have reached out to over 50 local businesses, mostly small, with information about the Subsidized Employment Pathway to Self-Sufficiency project and the opportunity to meet their workforce needs that it offers—to try and to train potential new employees to their specifications.

As of April 30, 2025, 15 companies have entered into worksite agreements with work2future, and nine of them have brought on board at least one subsidized employee, as indicated in the following table.
